



# The Smarter Balanced Assessment System For English Language Learners and Their Families

## Introduction: What is the Smarter Balanced Assessment System?

The Smarter Balanced Assessment system measures what students have learned in English Language Arts and Math. The assessment system is aligned to Washington State Learning Standards. There are two assessment types, **summative** and **interim**, and most students will take the assessment on a computer.

Smarter Balanced Summative Assessment – General Information	
<b>Who</b>	The summative assessment will test all students in grades 3–8 and 11.
<b>What</b>	The summative and interim tests will assess English Language Arts and Mathematics.
<b>When</b>	Smarter Balanced will begin during the 2014-15 school year. Students in grades 3-8 will take the test within the last twelve weeks of the school year; for grade 11, the test will be given in the last seven weeks of the school year.
<b>Where</b>	The assessments will take place at the student’s school.
<b>Why</b>	Smarter Balanced measures student progress toward college and career readiness. It also is a tool for classroom monitoring of teaching and learning.
<b>How</b>	The assessments include item types such as: multiple choice, short answer, and essay (multiple paragraphs).

The required summative assessment tests the full range of Washington State Learning Standards in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics for students in grades 3–8 and 11.

The interim assessment (optional for schools) identifies specific needs of the student and can be administered anytime or as many times as desired/required throughout the year. Interim assessments can also be used in grades 9 and 10.

Smarter Balanced assessments are not timed, and testing will occur in multiple sessions. Students will typically spend one to two hours per day on the summative assessments over several days. Smarter Balanced assesses writing at every grade level. The interim assessments vary in length of time required.
